## Izumi Kuremoto

Modern Japanese classical composer unloads '90s and '00s treasure trove.



Izumi Kuremoto is a rare find. The inventive New York-based composer,

capable of plucking heartstrings via the sparest of arrangements, has supported his art scurrying around the Big Apple as a cycle courier. The frenetic pace of his dayto-day is reflected on the disorienting, filmic Opening, swathes of swirling Enoesque electronic ambience underscoring brooding violins

and Judith McIntyre's earthy, operatic soprano. Shades of lannis Xenakis's Metastasis surface on elegant solo violin score Venus, while the Brooklyn String Quartet reveal an altogether jauntier side on Three Movements For Harp & Strings, Inspired by Mikio Naruse's post-war film classic, the title track pits Ellen Groningen's scordatura viola against Eric Phinney's spare vibes, allowing delicate glass slipper melodies to coalesce in

a breathtaking denouement.
